This manuscript is an original review article that has not been submitted elsewhere for publication. A brief synopsis of the review:

Many of the nutrients beneficial for intestinal health are present in normal foods, but their normal daily intake may be too low to exert optimum effects on intestinal barrier function and immune health. Evidence from laboratory and production animals strongly supports the use of approaches that supplement the diet with additional nutrients and nutraceuticals, however research in horses remains inconclusive. Careful consideration of the outcome desired for horses in care, together with the types of nutraceuticals available, is needed to develop effective strategies for maintenance of healthy intestinal barrier function and for treatment of various leaky gut syndromes in horses. The present review presents these issues in the context of what is known about the effects of nutrients on the equine g.i. tract and the intestinal microbiome.
